Getting around and about by bike and train

For longer trips, a short ride to the bus or train puts you well on the way. This

makes it easier to get to school or your workplace, or when travelling into Liverpool City Centre where parking can be a problem. Bikes go free on all Merseyside trains.

It only takes about 10 to 15 minutes from Liverpool South Parkway to the City Centre. Frequent Northern and City Line trains operate both from Liverpool South Parkway and Hunts Cross rail stations towards Liverpool

Lime Street and Liverpool Central in the City Centre and outwards for stations in Warrington, Widnes and Manchester.

To find out which bus or train you want, call Traveline on 0871 200 22 33 – a local person will talk you through the times, and anything else you might need.
